THE TARIFFS RECORDED IN THIS SCHEDULE BECOME EFFECTIVE ON 1 JULY 2025 FOR ALL ACCOUNTS RENDERED ON OR AFTER THIS DATE. ALL TARIFFS ARE SUBJECT TO VALUE ADDED TAX, UNLESS STATED OTHERWISE.

For the purposes of this tariff schedule the following shall mean:

“Act”

Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 2000 (Act no. 32 of 2000) together with the
Local Government: Municipal Finance Management (Act no. 56 of 2003);
Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act no. 6 of 2004);
Local Government Municipal Property Rates Amended Act, 2014 (Act no. 29 of 2014);
Municipal Fiscal Powers and Functions Act, 2007 (Act no. 12 of 2007).

“Development Charges”

For purposes of these charges please refer to the approved Guidelines, as amended from time to time for the calculation of Development Charges;

"Consumer"

independently of any other person or persons or body corporate, irrespective of whether electricity is used by such a consumer, used jointly with other consumers or used separately.

Annual Payment of Property rates

Applications to pay property rates on an annual basis can be submitted in writing to the George Municipality by the owner of the taxable property before 30 June of any financial year and stays in effect until further notice by the owner.

"Financial Year"

The “financial year” means a year ending on 30 June;

“Penalties”

Penalty charges calculated at the standard rate per annum, are payable as follows: -

date” on accounts. Normally the “due date” is the 15th day of the month which follows the month during which an account is rendered.

b) Accounts payable annually - accounts not fully paid after the date specified as “due date” on accounts. Normally the “due date” is 30 September of each year.

With regard to the determination of due dates:

performed or to take place on or before a certain day, at or before a certain time or during a certain period and such day, time or period falls, on or such period expires on a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday, such day, time or period shall be deemed to fall or expire on the succeeding day which is not a Saturday, Sunday or public holiday.

“Public Transport”

“Public Transport Services” means a scheduled public transport services for the carriage of passengers by road, for a fare as contemplated in this tariff list.

“Repeat offender”

similar offence, whether said offence occurred on the same property as the application in question or on another property, developed by that same owner or developer, at the time of charging the penalty.

"Standard rate"

and charges in arrears to Local Authorities will be raised at prime rate, as charged by the commercial banking industry of South Africa.

Waivers

Upon reasonable written motivation tariffs in this book may be waived upon in accordance with the system of delegations as approved by Council.

1. 2 Property Rates - Exemptions, reductions and rebates

Residential Properties: For all residential properties, the municipality will not levy a rate on the first R230 000 of the property's market value. The R230 000 is inclusive of the R15 000 statutory impermissible rate as per section 17(1)(h) of the Municipal Property Rates Act.

Rebates in respect of a category of owners of property are as follows:

1. Indigent owners:

All indigent owners, for rating purposes, will qualify in respect of their primary place of residence for the first R230 000 reduction, of the property's market value, plus for the rebates as stipulated under 2 below.

2. Low-income owners:

Owners with a collective income of less than R15 000 but not more than R16 500 per month, for rating purposes, will qualify in respect of their primary place of residence for the following rebates:

Gross Monthly Household Income	% Rebate
R0 up to R15 000 per month	40%
From R15 001 up to R16 500 per month	20%

3. Owners who are dependent on Pension or Social Grants for their livelihood:

Owners with a collective income of R390 000 per year (R32 500 per month) and who are older than 65 years, for rating purposes, will qualify for a 35% rebate on the first R2 250 000 valuation of their single primary residence.

Go George Smart Card Costs

The GO GEORGE Smart Card is the primary means of travel on the GO GEORGE Bus Service, where any individual over the age of four years needs to carry an active Smart Card with a valid trip to make use of the service.

The Promotional Card is applicable to passengers making use of the service for the first time and provide a valid identification document at purchase for verification. Each Promotional Card is pre-loaded with two free trips. Promotional Cards are only available for purchase at a GO GEORGE Kiosk.

GO GEORGE Vendor Commission

The commission payable to third-party vendors selling GO GEORGE Transit Products and Smart Card Products will remain at 10% for the 2025/26 financial year. This commission structure ensures consistency in vendor compensation. It is important to note that the commission offered to vendors does not impact the cost borne by passengers, as vendors are strictly prohibited from applying any surcharges on trips or cards sold to passengers.

GO GEORGE Concessions

The GO GEORGE Bus Service provides complimentary travel for children under the age of four years.

Additionally, concessions are extended to specific passenger categories as follows:

- (a) Uniformed GO GEORGE staff who are carrying out on-bus duties. Staff must present a valid staff card that indicates their eligibility to travel on the bus to the driver when boarding.
- (b) Uniformed officers of the law who can present a valid identification card when boarding. The concession is applicable to officers from the following agencies: South African Police Service, Municipal Traffic Service, Municipal Law Enforcement and Provincial Traffic Services.

GIPTN Reward System

The GIPTN Reward System aims to incentivise community engagement in the preservation of infrastructure within George. Residents are encouraged to report incidents of vandalism on GIPTN infrastructure. Those who come forward with information leading to the successful prosecution of perpetrators are eligible for a reward of R5,000. This system serves as a proactive measure to safeguard public assets and promote civic responsibility among residents.
