Clause number	The conditions of Tender are the Standard Conditions of Tender as contained in the Construction Industry Development Board (CIDB) Standard for Uniformity in Engineering and Construction Works Contracts, August 2019 (See www.cidb.org.za). The Standard Conditions of Tender for Procurements make several references to the Tender Data for details that apply specifically to this Tender. The Tender Data shall have precedence in the interpretation of any ambiguity or inconsistency between it and the standard conditions of Tender. C.1	General
C.1.1	Actions
C.1.1.1	The employer and each bidder submitting a tender offer shall comply with these conditions of tender. In the dealings with each other, they shall discharge their duties and obligations as set out in C.2 and C.3, timeously and with integrity, and behave equitably, honestly, and transparently, comply with all legal obligations and not engage in anticompetitive practices.
C.1.1.2	<p>The employer and the bidder and all their agents and employees involved in the tender process shall avoid conflicts of interest and where a conflict of interest is perceived or known, declare any such conflict of interest, indicating the nature of such conflict. Bidders shall declare any potential conflict of interest in their tender submissions. Employees, agents, and advisors of the employer shall declare any conflict of interest to whoever is responsible for overseeing the procurement process at the start of any deliberations relating to the procurement process or as soon as they become aware of such conflict and abstain from any decisions where such conflict exists or recuse themselves from the procurement process, as appropriate.</p> <p><i>Note: 1) A conflict of interest may arise due to a conflict of roles which might provide an incentive for improper acts in some circumstances. A conflict of interest can create an appearance of impropriety that can undermine confidence in the ability of that person to act properly in his or her position even if no improper acts result. 2) Conflicts of interest in respect of those engaged in the procurement process include direct, indirect or family interests in the tender or outcome of the procurement process and any personal bias, inclination, obligation, allegiance or loyalty which would in any way affect any decisions taken.</i></p>
C.1.1.3	The employer shall not seek, and a bidder shall not submit a tender without having a firm intention and the capacity to proceed with the contract.
C.1.2	Tender Documents

C.1.3	Interpretation
C.1.3.1	The tender data and additional requirements contained in the tender schedules that are included in the returnable documents are deemed to be part of these conditions of tender.
C.1.3.2	These conditions of tender, the tender data and tender schedules which are required for tender evaluation purposes, shall form part of any contract arising from the invitation to tender/quote.

C.1.3.3	<p>For the purposes of these conditions of tender, the following definitions apply:</p> <p>a) conflict of interest means any situation in which:</p> <p>i) someone in a position of trust has competing professional or personal interests which make it difficult to fulfil his or her duties impartially;</p> <p>ii) an individual or bidder is in a position to exploit a professional or official capacity in some way for their personal or corporate benefit; or</p> <p>iii) incompatibility or contradictory interests exist between an employee and the bidder who employs that employee.</p> <p>b) comparative offer means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts it can be utilized to have been taken into consideration;</p> <p>c) corrupt practice means the offering, giving, receiving or soliciting of anything of value to influence the action of the employer or his staff or agents in the tender process;</p> <p>d) fraudulent practice means the misrepresentation of the facts to influence the tender process or the award of a contract arising from a tender offer to the detriment of the employer, including collusive practices intended to establish prices at artificial levels.</p>

C.1.5	Cancellation and Re-Invitation of Tenders
C.1.5.1	<p>An employer may, prior to the award of the tender, cancel a tender if-</p> <p>a) due to changed circumstances, there is no longer a need for the engineering and construction works specified in the invitation;</p> <p>b) funds are no longer available to cover the total envisaged expenditure; or</p> <p>c) no acceptable tenders are received.</p> <p>d) there is a material irregularity in the tender process.</p>
C.1.5.2	The decision to cancel a tender invitation must be published in the same manner in which the original tender invitation was advertised.
C.1.5.3	An employer may only with the prior approval of the relevant treasury cancel a tender invitation for the second time.
C.1.6	Procurement procedures
C.1.6.1	General
	Unless otherwise stated in the tender data, a contract will, subject to C.3.13, be concluded with the bidder who in terms of C.3.11 is the highest ranked or the bidder scoring the highest number of tender evaluation points, as relevant, based on the tender submissions that are received at the closing time for tenders.
C.1.6.2	Competitive negotiation procedure
C.1.6.2.1	Where the tender data requires that the competitive negotiation procedure is to be followed, bidders shall submit tender offers in response to the proposed contract in the first round of submissions. Notwithstanding the requirements of C.3.4, the employer shall announce only the names of the bidders who make a submission. The requirements of C.8 relating to the material deviations or qualifications which affect the competitive position of bidders shall not apply.

C.1.6.2.2	<p>All responsive bidders or at least a minimum of not less than three responsive bidders that are highest ranked in terms of the evaluation criteria stated in the tender data shall be invited to enter competitive negotiations based on the principle of equal treatment, keeping confidential the proposed solutions and associated information.</p> <p>Notwithstanding the provisions of C.2.17, the employer may request that tenders be clarified, specified, and fine-tuned in order to improve a bidder's competitive position provided that such clarification, specification, fine-tuning or additional information does not alter any fundamental aspects of the offers or impose substantial new requirements which restrict or distort competition or have a discriminatory effect.</p>
C.1.6.2.3	At the conclusion of each round of negotiations, bidders shall be invited by the employer to revise their tender offer based on the same evaluation criteria, with or without adjusted weightings. Bidders shall be advised when they are to submit their best and final offer.
C.1.6.2.4	The contract shall be awarded in accordance with the provisions of C.3.11 and C.3.13 after bidders have been requested to submit their best and final offer.
C.1.6.3	Proposal procedure using the two stage-system N/A
C.1.6.3.1	Option 1
	Bidders shall in the first stage submit technical proposals and, if required, cost parameters around which a contract may be negotiated. The employer shall evaluate each responsive submission in terms of the method of evaluation stated in the tender data, and in the second stage negotiate a contract with the bidder scoring the highest number of evaluation points and award the contract in terms of these conditions of tender.
C.1.6.3.2	Option 2
C.1.6.3.2.1	Bidders shall submit in the first stage only technical proposals. The employer shall invite all responsive bidders to submit tender offers in the second stage, following the issuing of procurement documents.
C.1.6.3.2.2	The employer shall evaluate tenders received during the second stage in terms of the method of evaluation stated in the tender data and award the contract in terms of these conditions of tender.
C.2	Bidder's obligations
C.2.1	Eligibility
C.2.1.1	<p>Only those tenderers who are registered with the CIDB, or are capable of being so prior to the evaluation of submissions, in a contractor grading designation equal to or higher than a contractor grading designation determined in accordance with the sum tendered, or a value determined in accordance with Regulation 25 (1B) or 25(7A) of the Construction Industry Development Regulations, for an ME class of construction work, are eligible to have their tenders evaluated.</p> <p>It is estimated that the grading required for this quotation to be an 1GB or higher.</p> <p>Contractors registered as potentially emerging enterprises with the CIDB who are registered in one contractor grading designation lower than that required in terms of the requirement above and who satisfy all other Eligibility Criteria in terms of this Tender, may submit tender offers</p>

C.2.1.2	Notify the employer of any proposed material change in the capabilities or formation of the tendering entity (or both) or any other criteria which formed part of the qualifying requirements used by the employer as the basis in a prior process to invite the bidder to submit a tender offer and obtain the employer's written approval to do so prior to the closing time for tenders.	
C.2.2	Cost of tendering	
C.2.2.1	Accept that, unless otherwise stated in the tender data, the employer will not compensate the bidder for any costs incurred in the preparation and submission of a tender offer, including the costs of any testing necessary to demonstrate that aspects of the offer comply with requirements.	
C.2.2.2	The cost of the tender documents charged by the employer shall be limited to the actual cost incurred by the employer for printing the documents. Employers must attempt to make available the tender documents on its website so as not to incur any costs pertaining to the printing of the tender documents.	
C.2.3	Check documents	
	Check the tender documents on receipt for completeness and notify the employer of any discrepancy or omission.	
C.2.4	Confidentiality and copyright of documents	
	Treat as confidential all matters arising in connection with the tender. Use and copy the documents issued by the employer only for the purpose of preparing and submitting a tender offer in response to the invitation.	
C.2.5	Reference documents	
	Obtain, as necessary for submitting a tender offer, copies of the latest versions of standards, specifications, conditions of contract and other publications, which are not attached but which are incorporated into the tender documents by reference.	
C.2.6	Acknowledge addenda	
	Acknowledge receipt of addenda to the tender documents, which the employer may issue, and if necessary, apply for an extension to the closing time stated in the tender data, to take the addenda into account.

C.2.8	Seek clarification	
	Request clarification of the tender documents, if necessary, by notifying the employer at least five (5) working days before the closing time stated in the tender data.	
C.2.9	Insurance	

	Be aware that the extent of insurance to be provided by the employer (if any) might not be for the full cover required in terms of the conditions of contract identified in the contract data. The bidder is advised to seek qualified advice regarding insurance.
C.2.10	Pricing the tender offer
C.2.10.1	Include in the rates, prices, and the tendered total of the prices (if any) all duties, taxes except Value Added Tax (VAT), and other levies payable by the successful bidder, such duties, taxes, and levies being those applicable fourteen (14) days before the closing time stated in the tender data.
C.2.10.2	Show VAT payable by the employer separately as an addition to the tendered total of the prices.
C.2.10.3	Provide rates and prices that are fixed for the duration of the contract and not subject to adjustment except as provided for in the conditions of contract identified in the contract data.
C.2.10.4	State the rates and prices in Rand unless instructed otherwise in the tender data. The conditions of contract identified in the contract data may provide for part payment in other currencies.
C.2.11	Alterations to documents
	Do not make any alterations or additions to the tender documents, except to comply with instructions issued by the employer, or necessary to correct errors made by the bidder. All signatories to the tender offer shall initial all such alterations.
C.2.12	Alternative tender offers
C.2.12.1	Unless otherwise stated in the tender data, submit alternative tender offers only if a main tender offer, strictly in accordance with all the requirements of the tender documents, is also submitted as well as a schedule that compares the requirements of the tender documents with the alternative requirements that are proposed.
C.2.12.2	Accept that an alternative tender offer must be based only on the criteria stated in the tender data or criteria otherwise acceptable to the employer.
C.2.12.3	An alternative tender offer must only be considered if the main tender offer is the winning tender.
C.2.13	Submitting a tender offer
C.2.13.1	Submit one tender offer only, either as a single tendering entity or as a member in a joint venture to provide the whole of the works identified in the contract data and described in the scope of works, unless stated otherwise in the tender data.
C.2.13.2	Return all returnable documents to the employer after completing them in their entirety, either electronically (if they were issued in electronic format) or by writing legibly in non-erasable ink.
C.2.13.3	Submit the parts of the tender offer communicated on paper as an original plus the number of copies stated in the tender data, with an English translation of any documentation in a language other than English, and the parts communicated electronically in the same format as they were issued by the employer.

C.2.13.4	Sign the original and all copies of the tender offer where required in terms of the tender data. The employer will hold all authorized signatories liable on behalf of the bidder. Signatories for bidders proposing to contract as joint ventures shall state which of the signatories is the lead partner whom the employer shall hold liable for the purpose of the tender offer.
C.2.13.5	Seal the original and each copy of the tender offer as separate packages marking the packages as "ORIGINAL" and "COPY". Each package shall state on the outside the employer's address and identification details stated in the tender data, as well as the bidder's name and contact address.
C.2.13.6	Where a two-envelope system is required in terms of the tender data, place and seal the returnable documents listed in the tender data in an envelope marked "financial proposal" and place the remaining returnable documents in an envelope marked "technical proposal". Each envelope shall state on the outside the employer's address and identification details stated in the tender data, as well as the bidder's name and contact address.
C.2.13.7	Seal the original tender offer and copy packages together in an outer package that states on the outside only the employer's address and identification details as stated in the tender data.
C.2.13.8	Accept that the employer will not assume any responsibility for the misplacement or premature opening of the tender offer if the outer package is not sealed and marked as stated.
C.2.13.9	Accept that tender offers submitted by facsimile or e-mail will be rejected by the employer, unless stated otherwise in the tender data.
C.2.14	Information and data to be completed in all respects
	Accept that tender offers, which do not provide all the data or information requested completely and, in the form, required, may be regarded by the employer as non-responsive.
C.2.15	Closing time
C.2.15.1	Ensure that the employer receives the tender offer at the address specified in the tender data not later than the closing time stated in the tender data. Accept that proof of posting shall not be accepted as proof of delivery. The closing time for submission of offers is at 12H00 on Monday 20 October 2025.
C.2.15.2	Accept that, if the employer extends the closing time stated in the tender data for any reason, the requirements of these conditions of tender apply equally to the extended deadline.
C.2.16	Tender offer validity
C.2.16.1	The tender offer validity period is Eighty four (84) days.
C.2.16.2	If requested by the employer, consider extending the validity period stated in the tender data for an agreed additional period with or without any conditions attached to such extension.

C.2.16.3	Accept that a tender submission that has been submitted to the employer may only be withdrawn or substituted by giving the employer's agent written notice before the closing time for tenders that a tender is to be withdrawn or substituted. If the validity period stated in C.2.16 lapses before the employer evaluating tender, the contractor reserves the right to review the price based on Consumer Price Index (CPI).
C.2.16.4	Accept that a tender submission that has been submitted to the employer may only be withdrawn or substituted by giving the employer's agent written notice before the closing time for tenders that a tender is to be withdrawn or substituted. If the validity period stated in C.2.16 lapses before the employer evaluating tender, the contractor reserves the right to review the price based on Consumer Price Index (CPI).
C.2.17	Clarification of tender offer after submission
	Provide clarification of a tender offer in response to a request to do so from the employer during the evaluation of tender offers. This may include providing a breakdown of rates or prices and correction of arithmetical errors by the adjustment of certain rates or item prices (or both). No change in the competitive position of bidders or substance of the tender offer is sought, offered, or permitted. <i>Note: Sub-clause C.2.17 does not preclude the negotiation of the final terms of the contract with a preferred bidder following a competitive selection process, should the Employer elect to do so.</i>
C.2.18	Provide other material
C.2.18.1	Provide, on request by the employer, any other material that has a bearing on the tender offer, the bidder's commercial position (including notarized joint venture agreements), preferencing arrangements, or samples of materials, considered necessary by the employer for the purpose of a full and fair risk assessment. Should the bidder not provide the material, or a satisfactory reason as to why it cannot be provided, by the time for submission stated in the employer's request, the employer may regard the tender offer as non-responsive.
C.2.18.2	Dispose of samples of materials provided for evaluation by the employer, where required.
C.2.19	Inspections, tests, and analysis
	Provide access during working hours to premises for inspections, tests and analysis as provided for in the tender data.
C.2.20	Submit securities, bonds, and policies
	If requested, submit for the employer's acceptance before formation of the contract, all securities, bonds, guarantees, policies, and certificates of insurance required in terms of the conditions of contract identified in the contract data.
C.2.21	Check final draft
	Check the final draft of the contract provided by the employer within the time available for the employer to issue the contract.
C.2.22	Return of other tender documents
	If so, instructed by the employer, return all retained tender documents within twenty-eight (28) days after the expiry of the validity period stated in the tender data.
C.2.23	Certificates

	Include in the tender submission or provide the employer with any certificates as stated in the tender data.
C.3	The employer's undertakings
C.3.1	Respond to requests from the bidder
C.3.1.1	Unless otherwise stated in the tender Data, respond to a request for clarification received up to five (5) working days before the tender closing time stated in the Tender Data and notify all bidders who collected tender documents.
C.3.1.2	Consider any request to make a material change in the capabilities or formation of the tendering entity (or both) or any other criteria which formed part of the qualifying requirements used to prequalify a bidder to submit a tender offer in terms of a previous procurement process and deny any such request if as a consequence: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a) an individual firm, or a joint venture as a whole, or any individual member of the joint venture fails to meet any of the collective or individual qualifying requirements; b) the new partners to a joint venture were not prequalified in the first instance, either as individual firms or as another joint venture; or c) in the opinion of the Employer, acceptance of the material change would compromise the outcome of the prequalification process.
C.3.2	Issue Addenda
	If necessary, issue addenda that may amend or amplify the tender documents to each bidder during the period from the date that tender documents are available until three (3) working days before the tender closing time stated in the Tender Data. If, as a result a bidder applies for an extension to the closing time stated in the Tender Data, the Employer may grant such extension and, shall then notify all bidders who collected tender documents.
C.3.3	Return late tender offers
	Return tender offers received after the closing time stated in the Tender Data, unopened, (unless it is necessary to open a tender submission to obtain a forwarding address), to the bidder concerned.
C.3.4	Opening of tender submissions
